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this book tells the story of thalatta thalatta the sea the sea the shout first uttered on a mountain in eastern turkey by the army of 10 000 greek mercenaries whose adventures in what are now turkey syria and iraq were described by

the athenian historian and philosopher xenophon who also participated in the long march to the coast this story has played a persistent part in the european and american cultural tradition over the last two hundred years rood tells its story taking in literary masterpieces by writers such as heine shelley and joyce books of travel and adventure set in the middle east and elsewhere articles in victorian periodicals popular romantic novels newspaper editorials at the time of the british evacuation from dunkirk a painting by the 19th century artist benjamin robert haydon an unpublished radio play by louis macneice and a modern novel and film which transfer xenophon s story to new york

law of the sea in east asia selects the most prominent maritime legal issues that have emerged since the post los convention era for a detailed discussion and assessment the current marine legal order in east asia is based on the 1982 united nations convention on the law of the sea los convention and accordingly coastal states in the region are obliged to cooperate amongst themselves to exercise their rights and perform their duties keyuan a respected expert in the fields of international and chinese law explores issues concerning compliance with the law of the sea territorial disputes and maritime boundary delimitation fishery management safety of navigation and maritime security and neglected issues in the law of the sea this is the first book to examine maritime laws in east asia and as such will appeal to academics of law and asian studies lawyers and policy makers

the sea is a prestigious series with a history going back to the classic three volume treatise published by wiley in 1962 63 now under the leadership of allan robinson the series is again being extended with five new volumes currently planned that emphasizing the interaction of physical chemical and biological oceanography coastal ocean phenomena is the first of these new volumes and it deals with the general principles governing ocean phenomena in regions of shallower water near land processes such as tidal effects global sea level changes biological productivity and sediment transport are analyzed models and methods are emphasized including remote sensing models of coastal ocean circulation and data acquisition volume 10 presents the general principles and volume 11 is organized geographically to presents the results of 35 of regional studies eastern north america the caribbean the north sea and baltic the mediterranean sea and so forth volume 10 is a readable and systematic introduction to coastal oceanography that is suitable for use with college courses while volume 11 is a much larger reference work note that volumes 10 and 11 are available together as a set isbn 0471 11543 6 tent 175 00

humanity can make short work of the oceans creatures in 1741 hungry explorers discovered herds of steller s sea cow in the bering strait and in less than thirty years the amiable beast had been harpooned into extinction it s a classic story but a key fact is often omitted bering island was the last redoubt of a species that had been decimated by hunting and habitat loss years before the explorers set sail as callum m roberts reveals in the unnatural history of the sea the oceans bounty didn t disappear overnight while today s fishing industry is ruthlessly efficient intense exploitation began not in the modern era or even with the dawn of industrialization but in the eleventh century in medieval europe roberts explores this long and colorful history of commercial fishing taking readers around the world and through the centuries to witness the transformation of the seas drawing on firsthand accounts of early explorers pirates merchants fishers and travelers the book recreates the oceans of the past waters teeming with whales sea lions sea otters turtles and giant fish the abundance of marine life described by fifteenth century

seafarers is almost unimaginable today but roberts both brings it alive and artfully traces its depletion collapsing fisheries he shows are simply the latest chapter in a long history of unfettered commercialization of the seas the story does not end with an empty ocean instead roberts describes how we might restore the splendor and prosperity of the seas through smarter management of our resources and some simple restraint from the coasts of florida to new zealand marine reserves have fostered spectacular recovery of plants and animals to levels not seen in a century they prove that history need not repeat itself we can leave the oceans richer than we found them
